

Common & Proper Nouns

A noun can be either **common** or **proper**. A proper noun is the name of something specific, such as a person, place, company or idea. They are capitalized because they are names. Common nouns are not specific. They are only capitalized if they are the first word in a sentence.

Example:

Did you hear that Toyota is building a new electric car?

Toyota is the name of a company, so it is a proper noun and is capitalized. **Car** is a common noun because it does not name a specific car. It does not get capitalized.
